"COUNT ME IN" OUTSTANDING ATTENDANCE AWARDS

Students learn best when they are in school. Knowing how important it is to be present each day, this year we will be recognizing students who have outstanding attendance through our new "Count Me In" program. Each 9-weeks students who meet an attendance rate of at least 95% will be recognized, as well as placed in a drawing for a grand prize! This means a student can miss up to two days per nine-weeks and still be recognized for outstanding attendance. We will not recognize perfect attendance, as we still want students who are truly ill to stay home and not infect others.

All who receive Outstanding Attendance Recognition will...

- Receive a "brag tag" of their choice to add to their backpack (see examples below).
- Be entered in a drawing for various prizes. Some examples of the items being given away are \$50 Roxy Movie gift card, free 10" pizza and breadstick order from Deangelo's Pizza, and various other items from community businesses.
- At the end of the year, those who have had outstanding attendance for the entire year will be entered into a grand prize drawing.

VISUAL THINKING SKILLS PROGRAM BEGINS

The Visual Thinking Strategies (VTS) program is sponsored by the Honeywell Educational Outreach program and is for 4th - 6th grade students. It is designed to build students' background knowledge and develop thinking skills that use detail to enhance understanding. Many educators have used this method as a precursor to working on a literary or writing passage because the thinking skills used to analyze artwork can be transferred to language arts as well. The Visual Thinking Strategies (VTS) method was created by Abigail Housen, a cognitive psychologist in the Harvard Graduate School of Education.
